PCSD Return to School

Park City School District will reopen schools and welcome students for in-person instruction on August 30, 2020. The health and safety of our students and staff during the ongoing pandemic is imperative. Our focus is keeping everyone as **READY** to return to school.

Returns for learning

In-person Learning: Learning at school following a traditional Monday-Friday schedule with modifications for health and safety.

Remote Learning: Learning at home following a daily schedule.

All PCSD students will be assigned to in-person learning based on selection. Families that prefer to enroll their student(s) for remote learning will need to complete the remote learning form. We understand families may be unsure about choosing an instructional model so may have needs that can be addressed by meeting with a counselor.

Enhanced hygiene protocols

Face Coverings: All students, staff, and visitors will be required to wear a face covering.

Handwashing: Frequent handwashing and sanitizing will be taught and practiced throughout the school day.

Healthy Habits: Staff and students encouraged to cover coughs and sneezes and avoid physical contact such as handshakes and high fives.

Anyone with symptoms stays home

Symptom Screening: Families and schools are partners in recognizing symptoms and staying home when sick.

School Visitors: Visitors to school will be screened for symptoms upon entry.

Distancing measures

Physical Distancing: Classroom seating and activities promote physical distancing whenever possible.


Traffic Flow Direction: Directional signs placed in classrooms, in the building to direct traffic during transitions.

Transportation: All bus passengers will be required to wear a face assigned seating.

Playgrounds: Playgrounds will be open for recess with physical distancing.

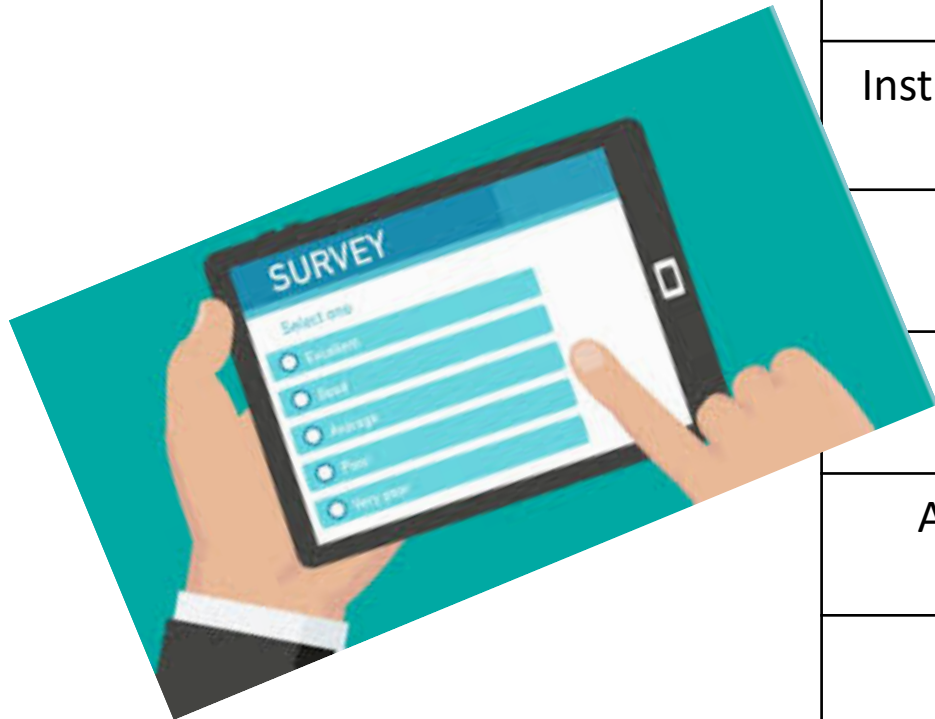
Yes! Added cleaning and disinfecting

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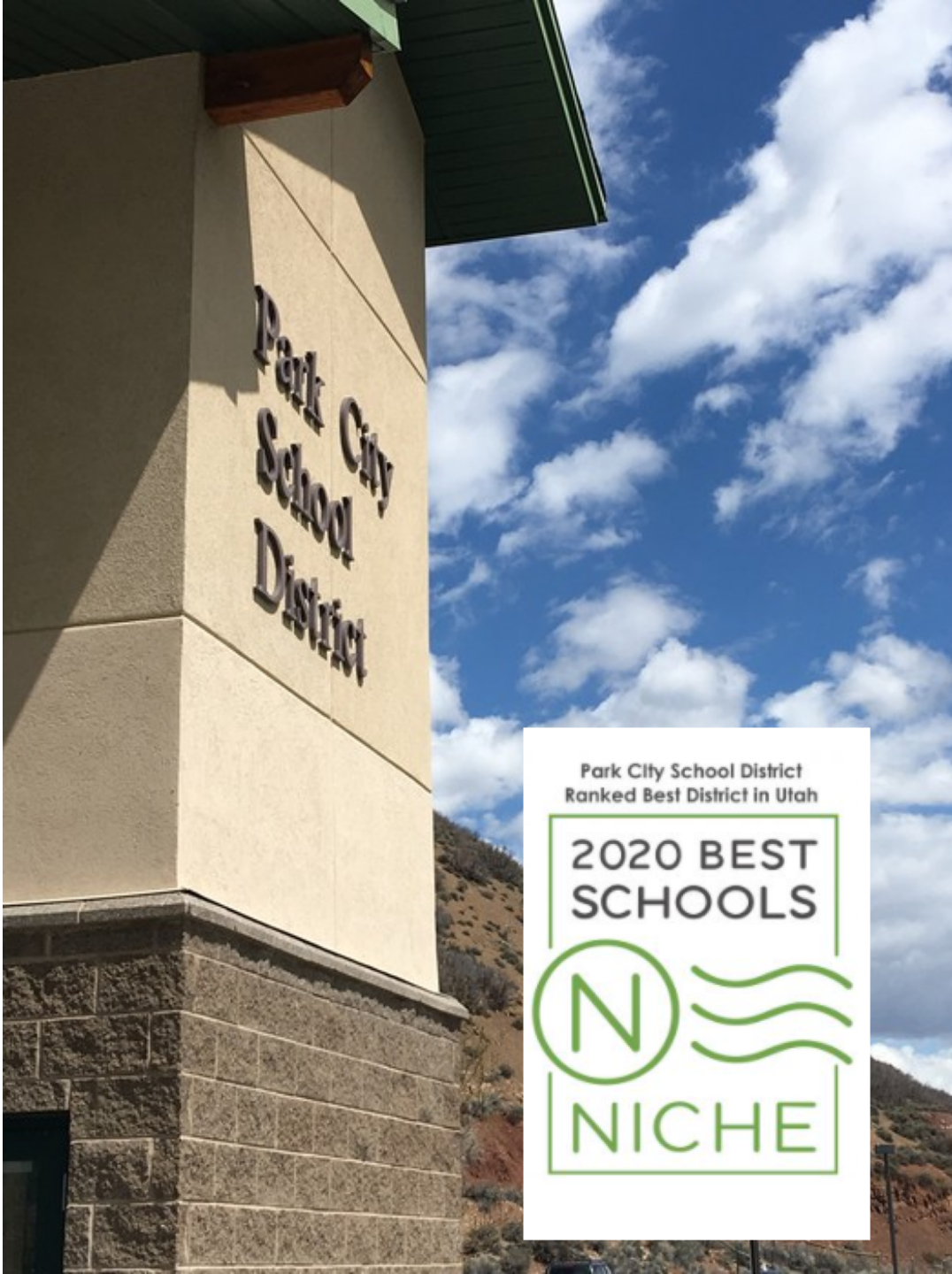
